Proceedings of the 9th General Body Meeting of the Indian Society of Plant Genetic Resources, New Delhi

March 13, 2018

The 9th General Body (GB) Meeting of the Indian Society of Plant Genetic Resources (ISPGR) was held on March 13, 2018 at ICAR-NBPGR, New Delhi, under the Chairmanship of Dr R.S. Paroda, President, ISPGR (Annexure 1). The meeting was attended by 33 members of ISPGR. The General Secretary (Interim), Dr J.C. Rana, welcomed the President, Members of the Executive Council and other esteemed members of ISPGR.

Report by the General Secretary

The GB was informed that the EC in its meeting held on October 17, 2017, had nominated Dr J.C. Rana (Joint Secretary) as interim General Secretary of ISPGR till next elections of ISPGR, consequent upon departure of Dr R.K. Tyagi (General Secretary) from India. Further, Dr D.B. Parakh (Councillor, North Zone) was nominated as interim Joint Secretary, ISPGR, also till next elections of ISPGR. Thereafter, Dr J.C. Rana presented General Secretary's Report which was approved by the GB (Annexure 2).

Report by the Editor-in-Chief

The GB was informed that the EC in its meeting held on October 17, 2017, had nominated Dr Sunil Archak as next Editor-in-Chief of IJPGR, after availing the services of Dr R.R. Hanchinal as Editor-in-Chief, 2016 to 2017. Dr Sunil Archak, presented the progress report regarding the progress of IJPGR (Annexure 3), which was approved by the GB.

Report by the Treasurer

Dr Anuradha Agrawal, Treasurer, presented the summary of audited report for ISPGR as well as IAC 2016 (Annexure 4), which was approved by the GB. A copy of the audited report for the FY 2016-17 is appended as Annexure 5. It was also informed to the GB that based on advice from EC, a new Charted Accountant (M/S Dadu Dadoo and Associates, C-13 Mansarover Garden, New Delhi - 110015) had been appointed w.e.f. Nov. 23, 2017, who were given the task to seek provision of income tax exemption for ISPGR, besides the routine auditing and ITR work. The GB was also apprised about the permanent assets acquired by the Society during this period, which included a computer, printer, furniture for office and air-conditioner. Dr Anuradha Agrawal placed on record great appreciation for Dr R.S. Paroda, President, ISPGR for his outstanding role in generating funds for IAC 2016, which led to an unprecedented saving for ISPGR (more than Rs 30 lakhs in the FY 2016-17), which was supported by the GB through a standing ovation.

The following agenda items were discussed:

Agenda No. 1: Confirmation of proceedings of last GB meeting held on March 5, 2015.

Proceedings were confirmed by the GB of the ISPGR. It was suggested that GB should be held every year, which was unanimously agreed upon.

(Action: General Secretary, ISPGR)

Agenda No. 2: National conference on agrobiodiversity related issues to be organised by ISPGR, ICAR and other stake holder including CG centres as pre-event to 2nd Agrobiodiversity Congress in 2018-19.

Members of the GB appreciated the efforts made by ISPGR in organization of the Ist International Agrobiodiversity Congress (IAC 2016), as well as the other meetings held before and after this mega-

event. It was suggested that tangible actions need to be taken as a follow-up for Delhi Declaration on Agrobiodiversity Management, by the concerned institutional stakeholders. Another issue was the concern to enhance utilization of PGR, and inclusion of other stakeholder besides ICAR/SAUs like CSIR, DRDO, DBT, DST for this purpose. Accordingly, ISPGR to consider hosting a national conference with the relevant players. GB members were invited to provide suitable topics for this conference to the EC. A meeting may be scheduled for planning such an event, at the earliest.

(Action: General Secretary, ISPGR & Director, NBPGR)

Agenda No. 3: Re-constitution of Editorial Board

The GB members expressed appreciation of the EIC and Editorial members of IJPGR, for the increase in NAAS rating of the journal (from 4.61 to 5.12), besides improvement in quality of papers, periodicity, look and feel of the journal. It was informed by EIC that Springer India was being approached for consider publishing the journal. However, Dr Sushil Kumar opined that it would be better if IJPGR was published by the society itself, as in his opinion, journals being published by big publication houses tended to become weak. It was agreed by the GB that IJPGR should expand its purview and publish reports, reviews, opinions, gene saviour awards etc., besides the research articles related to PGR. The GB also approved reconstitution of Editorial Board.

(Action: Editor-in-Chief, IJPGR)

Agenda No. 4 & 5: Enhancement of life membership fee of ISPGR and exploring the ways and means to enhance resource generation through institutional membership and other activities

It was agreed that subscription rates of the Society be enhanced, considering the escalating costs for routine activities. The following revised rates were agreed upon by the GB:

Dr R.S. Paroda thanked all the GB for their presence and said it was praiseworthy that ISPGR had emerged as a vibrant Society. He recalled the genesis of the Society under him in 1987, when other journals would not easily publish works related to PGR. He emphasized there was need for continuous nurturing of the Society, having come so far. He said that harmony was important for a Society to be functional, and frequent events need to be organized for greater interaction amongst the

members. He informed that ISPGR website was regularly updated to record all events. He urged more events be organized for greater visibility and IJPGR should increase its coverage. He appreciated the efforts of all EC members in the functioning of the Society and the tremendous institutional support provided by Dr Kuldeep Singh, Director, NBPGR in all activities of the Society. He recorded his happiness at the financial position of the Society and thanked all those who had contributed in the funding as well as organization of the IAC 2016. He placed on record his appreciation for Dr P.N. Mathur, R.K. Tyagi, R.C. Agrawal, Anuradha Agrawal and Sunil Archak for their great contribution in IAC 2016. He thanked Dr R.K. Tyagi for his dedicated services to ISPGR for more than two decades in various capacities. He urged all members to actively participate in Society events with zeal and enthusiasm.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair and all the GB members, proposed by Dr D.B. Parakh, Joint Secretary (Interim).

1. Details of Membership

Presently, a total 700 Life members (102 members added), 32 Annual/Institutional members are enrolled. These belong to 11 international and 120 national organizations. Efforts have been made to increase the members by approaching individuals and international and national institutions.

2. Executive Council (EC) meetings, events organised, new initiatives and decision taken

A total of nine meetings of EC were held to discuss and decide the various issues related to activities and growth of the society. Majority of the meetings were related to the organisation 1st International Agrobiodiversity Congress (IAC 2016), held during Nov. 6-9, 2016.

3. Organizing the 1st International Agrobiodiversity Congress (IAC 2016)

ISPGR, in collaboration with Bioversity International, with financial support from 21 organizations and supported by 7 knowledge/institutional partners organized a first-of-its-kind IAC 2016, which was inaugurated by Hon'ble Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi. The IAC 2016 involved 13 international, 13 national agencies and 125 individuals as part of International Advisory Committee, National Steering Committee, Core Organizing Committee, Technical Program Committee and Local Organizing Committee. This event became a reality due to the personal interest and excellent guidance provided by Prof. M.S. Swaminathan, Chair of the International Advisory Committee; Dr R.S. Paroda, Co-Chair of the International Advisory Committee and Chair of the National Steering Committee and Dr T. Mohapatra, Secretary, Department of Agriculture Research and Education (DARE) & DG, Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) and Dr S. Ayyappan, his predecessor, for extending steadfast institutional support. The IAC 2016 provided an excellent opportunity for exchange of views among the 1,000 participants hailing from 60 countries. The goal was to formulate a road map for management of genetic resources in tune with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Accordingly, recommendations emerging on major issues have been synthesized in the Proceedings, which has been widely circulated and available on ISPGR web page. Prof. M.S. Swaminathan has written to Hon'ble PM to approach UN for declaring a 'Year of Agrobiodiversity'.

We place on record our gratitude to all who were directly or indirectly involved in successful organization of the IAC 2016. Specifically, we place on record thanks to Bioversity International, ICAR, Protection of Plant Varieties and Farmers Right Authority (PPV&FRA), National Biodiversity Authority (NBA), Trust for Advancement of Agricultural Sciences (TAAS), National Academy of Agricultural Sciences (NAAS), M.S. Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF), Indian Society of Genetics and Plant Breeding (ISGPB), International Maize and Wheat Improvement Centre (CIMMYT), Borlaug Institute for South Asia (BISA), International Centre for Research in Semi-arid Tropics (ICRISAT), German Corporation for International Cooperation(GIZ), Asia-Pacific Association of Agricultural Research Institutes (APAARI), Global Crop Diversity Trust (GCDT), Japan International Research Centre for Agricultural Sciences (JIRCAS), Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research (ACIAR), International Centre for Research in Dryland Areas (ICARDA), Centre for Agriculture and Biosciences International (CABI), Kirkhouse Trust, Madhya Pradesh State Biodiversity Board (MPSBB), Maharashtra Hybrid Seeds Company Private Limited (MAHYCO), Association of Biotechnology-Led Enterprise-Agriculture Group (ABLE-AG), Rasi Seeds, Controlled Environment Limited (CONVIRON), Food and Agriculture Organization of United Nations (FAO), National Innovation Foundation (NIF), Anand and Anand and EcoAfrica for supporting in holding the IAC 2016.

I am happy to inform you that the specific recommendations under each of the Congress themes and overall recommendations as "Delhi Declaration on Agrobiodiversity Management" emerged as an

outcome of the IAC 2016. Their systematic implementation will help both national and international organizations/agencies for effective conservation and use of agrobiodiversity for ensuring food and nutritional security and also to address the emerging challenges associated with climate change.

Bioversity International has assured and taking lead to work out the modalities for exploring the possibilities to organize the 2nd IAC. ISPGR may become co-sponsor/co-organizer for next IAC.

4. Awareness Seminar cum Brainstorming Meeting on 'Access and Benefit Sharing: Striking the Right Balance'

This meeting was organized jointly by the ISPGR and Anand and Anand, a leading full service intellectual property Law Firm. The Trust for Advancement of Agricultural Sciences (TAAS) and the Indian Society of International Law (ISIL) were the knowledge partners for organizing the twin event, held at India Habitat Centre, New Delhi, India on October 22, 2016. The main aim was to bring on board issues related to agrobiodiversity access and benefit sharing (ABS) based on considered views of various stakeholders. The event provided an excellent opportunity for exchange of views among participants concerning use of genetic resources. The Proceedings have been published and are available on the ISPGR website.

5. Brainstorming session on the strategies implementation of 'Delhi Declaration on Agrobiodiversity Management' and & 75th Birthday Celebrations of Dr R.S. Paroda on August 28, 2017

The ISPGR co-hosted a brainstorming session along with the ICAR, NBPGR, Bioversity International, TAAS, PPV&FRA and ISGPB to chalk out a plan for effective implementation of the 12-point Delhi Declaration on Agrobiodiversity Management. This brainstorming meeting had the objective to develop a roadmap for conservation and utilization of genetic resources in synchrony with the Sustainable Development Goal (SDGs), Aichi Targets and National Biodiversity Targets (NBTs). The brainstorming meeting was followed by celebration of the 75th birthday of Dr RS Paroda. A commemorative book was also released on this occasion. The proceedings of the meeting are to be released in the award function of ISPGR scheduled on March 13, 2018 (afternoon).

6. Awards and Recognitions

- ISPGR award functions were held on March 5, 2015, April 5, 2017 and next one is scheduled soon after the GBM (March 13, 2018). Thus, all the awards due to be given by the society up to 2017 have been awarded.
- The various were awards given by the ISPGR were reviewed and award money were enhanced as follows:
 - > Dr H.B. Singh Memorial Award increased from Rs. 25,000 to 1,00,000.
 - > Dr R.S. Paroda Young Scientist Award from Rs. 10,000 to 20,000
 - > Dr R.K. Arora Best Paper Award (IJPGR) from Rs. 5,000 to 10,000
 - > Dr K.L. Mehra Best Student Award from Rs. 10,000 to 20,000
- A new award named after Dr B.R. Barwale has been instituted for 'Application/Excellence in PGR' to recognize the work of scientists/researchers who have significantly contributed in any area of PGR science or application, including collecting, characterization, evaluation, conservation, use (e.g. development of varieties) and other matters related to PGR management. The award is to encourage mid-level scientists (up to age of 55) working in the PGR domain. The first award will be given in the award function to be held on March 13, 2018 (afternoon).

7. Lecture Series

A new lecture series was initiated, named after Padma Bhusan 'Dr D.S. Athwal Memorial Lecture' to recognise his immense contribution to agriculture in general and development of National Genebank in India, being Vice-President, Winrock International (implementing agency of USAID Project in India) in particular. The first lecture will be delivered today afternoon by Padma Sri Dr Gurdev Singh Khush, World Food Prize Laureate and renowned rice breeder.

At the end I place thanks to all Executive Members and outstanding leadership of Dr R.S. Paroda, GB members, ICAR, ICAR-NBPGR and all other stake holders like TAAS, NAAS, PPVFRA, NBA, Bioversity International, etc. for their enormous support to ISPGR to achieve the goals. I place on record special thanks to my predecessor Dr R.K. Tyagi for nurturing the ISPGR for many years and at various capacities such as Vice President, Editor in Chief, General Secretary and Councillor.

Report by Editor-in-Chief

I am happy to present before you the EIC report for the period 2015-18.

The biennium 2016-2017 was an exceptional period for the Indian Journal of Plant Genetic resources (IJPGR). Thanks to the 1st International Agrobiodiversity Congress 2016 (IAC 2016), the IJPGR received greater attention in the international community by publishing a special agrobiodiversity issue (Volume 29, Issue 3, 2016). As a follow-up in 2017, 21 articles that were based on the presentations in IAC 2016, were published in volume 30 of IJPGR. In summary, we published 38 articles (eight by foreign authors) in the three issues of 2017. The journal received as many as 120 manuscript (ms) submissions in 2017.
